(Hints: Writer's reading - natives of Java - absence of articulate speech - vocal organ and centres of the brain weakend)

35. Make a review of the scenes from the excerpts of The Sixth Sense'.

(Hints: INT.SCHOOL LOBBY Late afternoon dialogues between Cole and Malcom – flashback INT.BEDROOM – Anna sleeping – Malcom's eyes filled with tear – Malcom muttering 'I am in love')

- 36. Give a vivid word picture of Azores as depicted in the travelogue by Mark Twain?
 - (**Hints :** Major inmates of the country, Slow, Lazy-Sleepy, Shiftless community reluctant towards Modern technology and advancement)
- 37. What was note taker doing when the pedestrians had been running for shelter into the market and under portico of St. Paul's Church? How did the mob behave with him?

(**Hints**: Taking down the words – the Bystander's advice to the flower girl – all turn to the man taking notes – the quarrel between the flower girl and note taker)

(**Hints**: Physical change – monstrous verminous bug – difficulties in the movement)

39. What does the poet want to convey about the Modern Society through the poem 'The Unknown citizen'?

(**Hints**: Served the greater community – poem as a mixture of wit and irony – totalitarianism – ideal citizen reduced to numbers – tries to satisfy every agencies – question of being satisfied in the modern society)

40. What are the obstacles faced by Magi on their journey to see the infant Christ? Why do they regret on their decisions? How do they overcome these impediments?

(**Hints**: Set out their journey at the worst of the year – Problem with transportation – feel regretted – offerings to infant Jesus – poetic devices used)

41. The bicycle in the poem 'Bicycle' describes an obsolete machine taken to a bare – living room. Are we reluctant to accommodate outdated things which were once an inevitable part of our life ? Substantiate.

(**Hints**: Bicycle as huge stick insects – the godhead invoked in a machine – as outdated machine – misfit will be removed-new technology replaces the old)

42. The 'Million Man March' speaks of the slave days and what possibly enslaves the blacks still today. Make a critical appreciation of the poem considering the present situations.

(**Hints**: The poem written in hope to end the discrimination – people to have equal justice – as an eye opener against slavery – what do the old spirits speak to us – spiritual renewal and bonding of all the black people).

43. In Act II, Pygmalion; Eliza's episode bath is illustrated with the mixture of comedy. Describe.

(**Hints**: Eliza admitted into Higgins' home – Mrs. Pearce takes incharge of Eliza – resisting taking bath – old cloths burnt alive – Pickering's behaviour, use Japanese dresses – entry of Doolittle)

44. What are the chaos created at home once Gregor Samsa was transformed into a huge insect? (focus on the reaction of mother and sister, father's harshness and manager's threat).

(**Hints**: Gregor as a travelling salesman – changed into a Monstrous insect – difficulties to adjust with the new changes – first sight of mother – Grete's reactions – father's reactions – entry of manager – manager retreats).
